• Rick McCorkle, Henry County Sheriff along with representatives from Motorola (Jay and Steve) gave a presentation to Council regarding the 800 series radio system for Emergency Services. The cost would be an estimated \$3 million dollars to bring Henry County into a system that would allow communication Statewide. Phase I is placement of towers at a cost of approximately \$1 million dollars. Phase II would be purchase of the radios with grants being applied for by the County and Schools and a 10 year lease purchase program available. President Koger appointed Councilman Peckinpaugh and Councilman Perdue as representatives of the City Council and requested that future meetings be forwarded to them. Steve informed that once the towers are placed the State will assume responsibility for maintenance as they have signed a contract through the year 2036.
