Councilman Guffey: Noted;

• Inquired as to how the ARP money is going to be paid out. President Peckinpaugh stated the ARP funds would only be paid out to the vendor as the work is completed.

Vice-President Hancock: Noted:

Asked to speak with traffic committee after the meeting.

Councilman Walden: Noted;

• Expressed his condolences for the Family of William "Bill" Miller who passed away. Councilman Walden stated he stopped and talked to him often and he kept a great eye on things going on in the area.

Councilman Dicken: Noted;

- Questioned what could be done with the orange barrels sitting at 12<sup>th</sup> and Broad and the hazard that it is creating. Mayor York stated the building commissioner can issue them a citation. Attorney Harvey stated that it would have to go thru City Court. Val McNelis stated on behalf of the Preservation Commission, they did not want to see the building torn down.
- Asked that anyone wanting to put anything in the time capsule, please reach out to me. There is no current date to reset the capsule. The Committee is currently looking into using an old safe in the Courthouse. There would be no change of water damage and would be kept in a climate-controlled area for the next 50 years.

Councilman Koger: Noted;

• Campaign signs are popping up everywhere. Someone needs to reach out to the election board. They are not supposed to be up until 60 days before the election.

Councilman Perdue: Noted;

President Peckinpaugh: Noted;

- Asked if we could send a letter to the railroad asking them to mow and take care of their weeds. Some of it is owned by the city and we mow part of it.
- Top half of the Jennings building. Police are spending a lot of time there. Said drug use is running rampant and is looking for some guidelines about getting these cleaned up.
- Stated that we need to start enforcing the curfew. To many kids are out after curfew when they shouldn't be.

### ADMINISTRATIVE REPORTS:

- Chief Schofield stated that his department needs to get some people hired. They have some Officers that are retiring and they only have one person left in the hiring pool. They will be starting a new pool very soon.
- Director Barker stated that the bridge on State Road 38 is being redone and they will be closing it starting today.
- Superintendent Walker, the spinning on the stop sign is \$95.00 and the flashing stop signs can go up to \$2,900.00.
- Mayor doesn't want to do anything right away regarding the stop lights. He asked that
  everyone talk to their constituents and see what they think about a 4 way stop there.
   Mayor York stated it would be a few months before we could even get a new stop light.
- President Peckinpaugh made a motion to make Indiana and Main a true 4-way stop and take out all turn lanes until we make a permanent decision. Councilman Koger seconded. Motion carried. Traffic Committee asked that they put stop ahead signs at least coming East on Indiana. Motion carried 7-0.
