Fourth: **REPORT IT** to the New Castle Police Department, New Castle

Emergency Unit, New Castle Fire Department, by calling 911...

Your emergency service providers will ensure proper disposal of the dangerous substances. The City of New Castle Police Department and Area Drug Task Force are working extremely hard to rid the city of drugs and drug paraphernalia and will continue to work hard on this endeavor. However, the Police Department and Emergency First-Aid Unit are requesting your assistance in helping us to insure the safety of our children in the community by following these guidelines. Your city emergency service providers are trained and equipped to pick up and dispose of any hazardous drugs and paraphernalia.
