Electronics We accept 40+ items of electronic scrap, including

computers, laptops, keyboards, mouses, DVD players, vacuum

cleaners, satellite equipment, phones, tools (drills, screwdrivers, etc.),

and much more for free. All televisions are a \$5 charge.

Plastics #1, #2, and #3 (examples: milk jugs, shampoo bottles,

2 liter bottles, water softener salt bags, Walmart bags

Glass Green, brown, and clear

Metal Aluminum, steel, and metal food cans

Paper Paper, paperboard boxes (cereal), junk mail, telephone books,

magazines, hardback books (complete; not necessary to remove cover),

catalogs, newspapers, and corrugated cardboard

*Latex paint, if not useable, can be disposed of in your normal trash **ONLY IF** you first add cat litter or saw dust to the contents and allow to dry out for approximately 72 hours.

*We accept CFLs and fluorescent bulbs at the district office. We also accept household batteries (A, AA, AAA, C, D, and 9 volt batteries) at the district office and in the Customer Service area of Walmart in New Castle.

ITEMS WE CANNOT ACCEPT:

Trash/rubbish, incandescent light bulbs, window panes, mirrors, ceramics, motor oil containers, anti-freeze containers, carpet, heat sensitive fax paper, napkins, paper towels, Kleenex, toilet paper, paper plates, cardboard w/food debris, building materials. TOX AWAY DAY
